

WHAT IS SHAPE BHAM?

Shape Bham is an initiative that brings academic trained researchers and city planners, alike, to translate research into practice, and to integrate health and equity into the Birmingham City planning process at the neighborhood level. As part of this endeavor we will pilot 20 neighborhood health report cards for 20 of Birmingham's 99 neighborhoods, with the intention of eventually replicating the report cards for the remaining 79 neighborhoods, pending available funding at later date.

WHAT ARE THE SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH?

The social determinants of health are the conditions in which people are born, grow, live, work and age. These circumstances are shaped by the distribution of money, power and resources at global, national and local levels. The social determinants of health are mostly responsible for health inequities - the unfair and avoidable differences in health status seen within and between countries.

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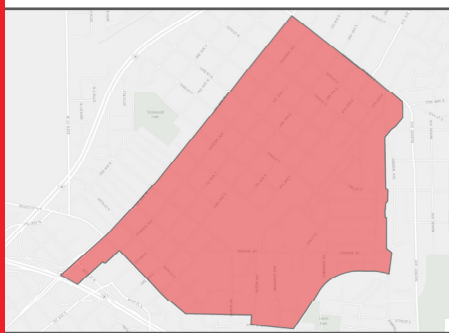

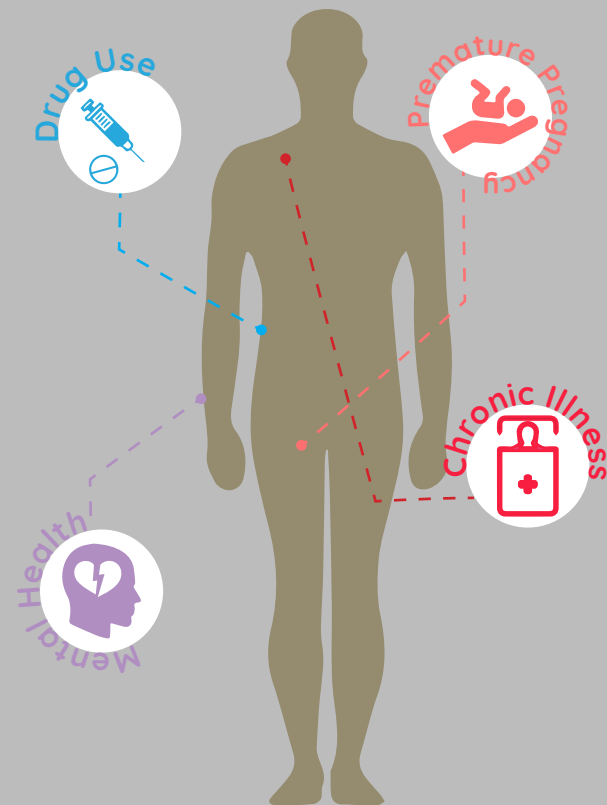

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RECOMMENDATIONS.

Some of the indicators your neighborhood received a "D" or lower grade on include: *Abandoned Properties, Business Retention, Excessive Housing Cost Burden and Voter Participation.* Poor scores in these indicators are linked to increased incidences of the following:



- Adopt "right size" development policies by promoting targeted revitalization strategies and natural landscape development.
- Partner with local career academies to create an avenue for students to gain internships, apprenticeships, and employment to fill labor market gaps and increase youth employment.
- Establish a technology pipeline for students in local high schools.
- Establish brownfield clean-up programs.

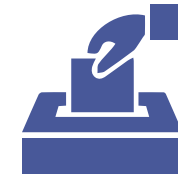
